The project required custom engineering and innovative load planning to fit the cargo into a Boeing 777F, saving over 30 days compared to ocean transport. The same precision and problem-solving approach will define Bremen's operations.

"The department in Bremen gives our clients direct access to specialized airfreight solutions with full IATA accreditation," says Tobias Teichmann, Head of Airfreight Germany. "It's about speed, safety, and flexibility—delivered by a team that understands the complexity of project cargo."
